## KNOW YOUR **NEEDLES!**

### **UNIVERSAL**

Slightly Rounded Tip

**FABRIC:** fleece, wool, velour, polyester, linen, wovens, knits (some), nylon, tulle, organza, synthetics: leather and suede.

**BENEFIT:** multiple uses

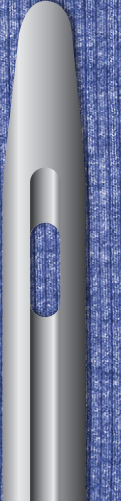


### **BALL POINT**

Rounded Tip

**FABRIC:** knits: jersey, rib knit, double knit, interlock knit

**BENEFITS:** Slips easily between yarn and fiber loops.



### **STRETCH**

Round tip with small bump

**FABRIC:** spandex, elastic, lycra, silk jersey, undergarments,

**BENEFITS:** eliminates skipped stitches



### **JEANS/DENIM**

Very sharp tip, strong body, small slender eye

**FABRIC:** canvas, twill, jeans, tightly woven fabrics

**BENEFITS:** tough, sturdy needle for sewing dense fabrics

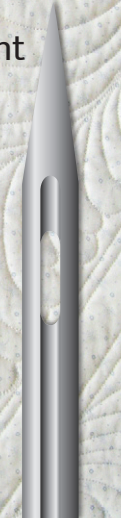


### **QUILTING**

Long, sharp thin point

**FABRIC:** cotton fabric and batting

**BENEFIT:** sews through multiple layers



### **LEATHER**

Slightly twisted arrowhead tip

**FABRIC:** real leather and suede, not synthetics.

**BENEFITS:** cuts through material easily



### **MICROTEX/SHARP**

Super sharp point

**FABRIC:** delicate or fine fabrics, sequined material, taffeta, silk, microfiber, organza, artificial suede and leather, coated fabrics

**BENEFITS:** best for topstitching



### **SELF-THREADING**

Open slit in head

**FABRIC:** wovens, knits, synthetic leather and suede

**BENEFITS:** easy to thread



### **MAGIC**

This rare needle is hard to find and isn't widely used. As a matter of fact, it's last known use was when Wendy used it to sew Peter Pan's shadow back on. 🧙
